We **engaged with 8 Children** in front of the CBCID Social Development office (aptly named "The Matchbox" to "light the spark in others'). The engagement was conducted and 4 of the kids returned home to Kalksteenfontein.

The *child with his dog* also returned home to Heideveld, noting that his mom is a single parent and unemployed.

The boy confirmed that he visits the area to earn some money to sustain his family back home and it is through reintegration efforts that we continue to collaborate with various stakeholders to assist not only on street but also at source.





These women lived on the streets of Camps Bay, where they begged. In the course of interacting with them and providing the social basket, these women accepted the help and were reunited with their loved ones. The ladies battled to support their families as they waited for an available spot on the Stewards program. Napier Haven kindly volunteered for days to help provide food parcels for their families.

65 Street People Engagements / 5 Adults & 4 Children Reunifications / 8 Shelter Placements / 7 New Stewards / 3 Stewards got permanent jobs

**Khaya** has been the in Camps Bay area for the past few years. The social basket of services was offered to Khaya and he did not hesitate to accept the assistance. He has successfully been placed at Safe Space 1. He also joined the ignisive Programme.

**Stanford**, also known as Rasta, has successfully been placed at Safe Space 1. Due to his rough years on the streets, for the past 20 years, suffering with the substance abuse "Alcohol", he has now also joined the Matrix Program. Stanford is now clean for 30 days so far. He has relapsed on 2 previous occasions and remembers that the struggle is real when in the recovery.

At ignisive we continue to be the crutches to our people who have lived on the streets and suffered so many types of trauma, including Substance Use Disorder. Commitment *off street first* and accountability is a key focus area in our reintegration and skills programmes.





## Community Safety always top of mind





The Steward teams were often first on the scene and *reported 4 accidents* over the festive season. We notified the control room for support and assisted with the clean up of the accident scenes.

The team also **supported with lost and found** whilst working over the season. They reported finding a number of valuable items to CBCID and handed items over to SAPS.

They even assisted in calling an ambulance when *medical help* was needed and *alerted* authorities of *crime incidences* (e.g. an assault situation).



# Caring for a Cleaner Environment





Our Field Operations Team supported Camps Bay City Improvement District with maintaining all the urban areas, pavements & walkways and also the drains. We cleaned all the steps and common areas and *collected a total of 547 bags of litter*, weeds, overgrown shrubs and rubble over the peak December/January season.

Our team provided extra (after hours) *support to CoCT Cleaning* teams, helping with beach cleanups in the early mornings over the season and after Boxing Day, New Year and the first two weekends of January 2025.

They have worked hard despite the hot conditions and learnt great skills with regards to customer service, timekeeping and other skill sets.

One of our Community Stewards, Lorraine, also helped with *cleaning our SAPS Victim Support Rooms* and a fridge that was kindly donated to SAPS.


